

Thunderbolt Wreck and a reef Marathon, Florida Keys Day SCUBA Trip, Advanced Level

Join us for a Marathon, Florida Keys trip. 2 dives, this requires Advanced openwater level and must meet the requirements on the back of this page. Space is limited, private charter, this will sell out, sign up asap! We are scheduled for the Thunderbolt wreck (100' dive) followed by a second dive on the wreck or a reef dive. Sites may change based on conditions, the operator reserves the right to substitute a different dive. Air tanks are included at the boat. You can bring your own nitrox tanks or rent them but they will limit you to the air timetables. You must bring/haul any other gear that you need, rental fees apply. This will be great fun! You must be in Marathon by 7:30 a.m.

****A minimum of 10 logged dives and one dive to a minimum depth of 60 feet within the past year. Documentation must be a written log or download from a computer. Divers must substantiate in written form proof of the day of experience that meets the above criteria. We will not except a computer or certification card as proof of experience.**

Required safety equipment:

- Timing device (computer or watch).
- Divers must wear a snorkel.
- Surface marker device.
- It is recommended that the divers have a cutting device or knife during the dive
- It is recommended that the divers wear gloves and exposure suit to protect against cuts or abrasion.

Safety procedures:

Guided dives on the *Thunderbolt* will be led by a staff instructor or dive master.

Dives will not exceed 100 feet in depth.

No penetration of the wreck will be allowed. Staff may guide through designated open swim-throughs.

NITROX mix or oxygen blend for customers will not exceed 32% oxygen.

If a diver leaves the group we will terminate the dive for that team and the missing diver protocol will be implemented. The guide will not go below 100 feet or enter the wreck to search for a missing diver.
